LESSONS FROM JOSEPH

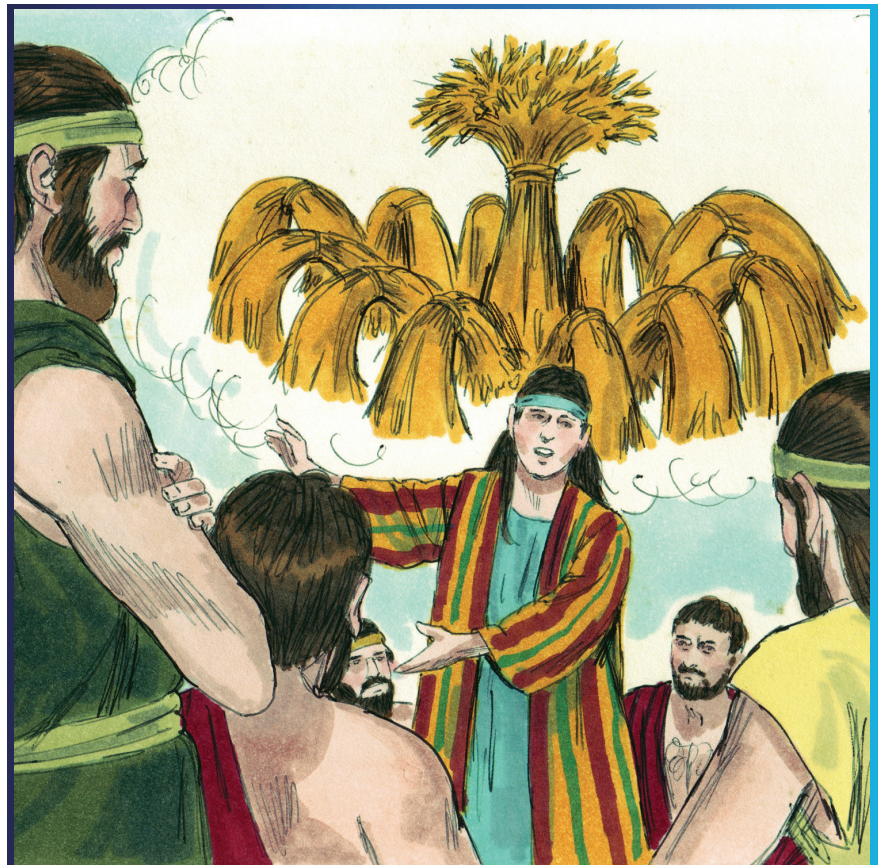
There are only three people I can think of in the Bible who weren't shown to have serious flaws, didn't make major mistakes, and didn't get reproved by God. Joseph is one of them.

Joseph was Jacob's eleventh son, born to his wife Rebekah. Jacob favored Joseph, obvious in the coat of many colors he made for him, and this sparked resentment among his older brothers (Gen. 37:3-4). Some think Joseph's brothers disliked him because of his dreams, but the Bible says it was because of Jacob's favoritism. Joseph's response to the dreams God gave him is what makes his story so powerful.

Imagine being only seventeen years old and getting dreams from God that your brothers will one day bow down to you. The next thing you know, you are faced with jealousy and betrayal, ultimately ending up in Egypt as a slave. One of the most amazing things about Joseph was that he not only endured hardship like very, very few people ever do, but he also did it with a good attitude. It's one thing to keep serving God with a good attitude when you don't have any other option. But do you know when the real test comes? When you have prosperity.

Joseph's rise to power occurred after he interpreted Pharaoh's dream, prophesying seven years of abundance followed by seven years of famine. In Genesis 41:46, we learn that Joseph was thirty years old when he finally stood before Pharaoh. Thirteen years had passed since God had given him dreams of his family bowing down to him.

What's truly amazing is that even though Joseph became the second most powerful man in the land and could've manipulated circumstances to force



his dreams to come true, he chose to serve Pharaoh faithfully, resisting the temptation to take matters into his own hands.

Do you see how prosperity is actually a greater indication of what's in a person's heart? Joseph was smart enough to recognize that God was the one who had promoted him and put him in this position, and he was waiting on God to bring those dreams to pass. I don't know if you get the significance of this or not, but it speaks volumes to me. I tell you, the restraint and wisdom Joseph exhibited are rare qualities.

This is really, really important and probably one of the most central things that I've learned through the life of Joseph. In our lives, the temptation to compromise integrity will arise. Joseph's story urges us to stay the course, trusting God and refusing to force outcomes on our own. Joseph had no animosity toward his brothers and no anger over what had been done to him. He chose to just wait and be dependent upon God.

Let me share some thoughts on this, and I'll keep it simple. There are some of you reading this right now, and you've been through some things. Even though you're still standing, you're doing it in your own strength and power. You aren't doing it with the right heart. And if you ever had the opportunity, you

would go to the person who wronged you and put them in their place. But brothers and sisters, you need to get to the place where there's no bitterness in you and you're just waiting on God to bring things to pass.

God loves you, and He doesn't want to put you in a position where Satan throws everything he's got at you and you don't have the maturity to be able to handle it. You need to learn how to just cool your jets and wait on God. This seems like a contradiction. On one hand, you've got to be bold. You've got to take advantage of the opportunities that God's given you. But on the other hand, you have to be under subjection to the Lord.

You know, a great analogy for this comes from something I learned while raising horses. I've had horses that were so stubborn, you practically had to force them to move. They did their own thing and didn't listen. On the flip side, I've had high-spirited Arabians, full of energy. If you let go of the reins, they'd bolt off like lightning. The key is to have a balance—a spirited horse that listens. If it's out of control, it's like riding a runaway horse, and that's scary.

The key is to have a mix of both traits. If God says to go, you go without hesitation. But at the same time, you need to stay in control. This is what I see in Joseph's story. For thirteen years, he had no choice as a slave and prisoner. But when he was given absolute power and authority, he remained in control, even when he could've done things his own way. Pharaoh gave him everything (Gen. 41:39-44), but he waited on God to fulfill the vision.

You need to be dependent upon God. And this is what I see in Joseph. This is one of the greatest things I've learned from him. He not only served God for thirteen years when there was no option, but when he had every option and could



have done some things on his own, he kept serving and depending upon God.

I've faced financial struggles when people offered me millions of dollars with strings attached. But their plans went against what God put in my heart, so I turned them down. It's really crucial to stay in control, just like Joseph did, waiting on God instead of compromising for temporary gain. Compromise is the language of the devil. Man, you don't need to compromise.

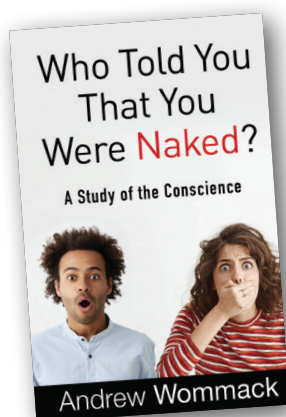

Why did Adam and Eve need a conscience after they disobeyed?

Initially, in the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve were unaware of their nakedness. But once they ate of the Tree, they became self-aware. They became fixated on self, and shame came upon them. Previously they had felt no shame. But all of a sudden, their consciences brought shame and fear of punishment.

These are things God never wanted us to have or experience. He never wanted us to be afraid. He didn't create us for rejection; He created us for fellowship. He didn't intend for us to have a conscience, but after Adam and Eve sinned, it became necessary.

You might be thinking that it would be nice just to somehow or another get rid of the conscience. But for someone who's lost, a conscience is necessary because it makes them aware of their sin and shows them the need for forgiveness. I personally believe that this is the reason the Lord had the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil in the garden. He had to give us a free choice to serve Him. Otherwise, we wouldn't be free moral agents. We would only love Him and serve Him because there was no other option. God didn't want robots. He had to give us the option.

Even though the conscience brings negative effects like shame and fear, it also provides



a positive function, which is to show us that we have sinned and that we need forgiveness. So, I believe God had a plan for us from the beginning.

Revelation 13:8 shows us that God knew we were going to rebel against Him:

And all that dwell upon the earth shall worship him, whose names are not written in the book of life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world.

He knew that we would sin and that Jesus would become the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world. Long before He even created us, He had planned everything out, and Jesus had already accepted God's plan for Him to come and redeem us.

If I could somehow imagine myself being God and I were going to create man—knowing that mankind would rebel against me and that there would be terrible things like the Holocaust, divorce, ungodliness, hatred, hurt, pain, and everything else that has entered the human race—I don't think I would have created man, not after knowing all the pain man would cause.

The only way I can understand why God still created mankind is that He saw you and me—those who would accept His payment for sin and become new creatures, being born again in His likeness—and decided that we were worth all of the pain and suffering. That's just amazing.

ABUNDANCE: Built to Receive

You have the incredible opportunity to experience as much of God as you want, and it's not based on your actions or performance.

For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily. And ye are complete in him, which is the head of all principality and power.

Colossians 2:9-10

In Christ, all the fullness of the Godhead lives within you. Yet many settle for just barely surviving or believe they need to do more to receive more of God. The truth is, you already have all of God. So **you and I can have as much of the kingdom of God today as we want.**

You might think that's a pretty bold statement, but the Word says if we abide in Him, He'll abide in us (John 15:4). If we stay connected to Him, we get to experience all the life of God.

That is abundance!

Whenever I find myself getting dry, distracted, or frustrated, God always takes me back to John 15. Why? Because He's the source—we can't do this by ourselves. We can't live in this world on our own.



John 15:4 says, "Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me" (New King James Version). He's saying, "If you're experiencing lack or feeling dry and broken, get to a place where you realize that you can't bear fruit by yourself."

As a branch, you were built to tap into the vine and draw on the life of God. John 15:5 says, "He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit" (NKJV).

So, let's reflect on our lives. If we're not bearing a lot of fruit or seeing abundance, it's not because we're disqualified from the love of God. God isn't crossing His arms and saying, "Nope, I'm not doing it." Instead, He's saying, "I'm here and available. If you tap into Me, if you learn to abide in Me, I will abide in you." We abide in Him by getting into His Word (John 15:7). Let's take the time to explore all the promises in the Word that He says are yes and amen (2 Cor. 1:20).

Take the limits off today and walk in abundance. It's your destiny.

A BETTER WAY TO RECEIVE

If you are trying to catch a baseball, the worst thing you can do is look down at yourself when the ball is coming your way. That's a good recipe for a bloody nose! The best way to catch it is to focus on the person who is throwing the ball. That sounds obvious when it comes to baseball, but this principle can be applied to receiving healing from God!

Do you struggle with receiving healing? Much like the baseball scenario, many of us are so focused on ourselves and our needs that we don't place ourselves in a good position to receive.

If you'd like to position yourself to receive from God, here are four aspects to focus on!

#1 God's glory. You were created for God's glory. Isaiah 43:7 says, "Even every one that is called by my name: for ***I have created him for my glory, I have formed him; yea, I have made him***" (emphasis added). It is paramount to understand that everything God does is for His glory, even healing!

In John 11:4, when Jesus found out that Lazarus was sick, He said, "This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby." Then Jesus healed him! God wants you well, but your healing is not strictly about you. It brings glory to God!

#2 God's character. God is good, and His heart is kind toward you! Matthew 14:14 says, "And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick." Every time Jesus healed



someone, His character was revealed. When you focus on God's character of compassion, it makes it easier to receive healing from Him.

#3 God's promises. God fulfilled His promises to you through Christ. Every time Jesus healed someone, it fulfilled Old Testament prophecy. Isaiah 35:5–6 prophesied that the blind would see, the deaf would hear, and the lame would walk. We should want to be healed not just for ourselves but because His promises will be fulfilled and His Word will be exalted!

#4 God's purpose. The ultimate goal for your healing is not just that you feel better; it's also for God's glory! Consider Peter's mother-in-law, who, after being healed, immediately started serving Jesus (Luke 4:38–39). Walking in complete healing allows you to better serve God and others and fulfill the unique call on your life.

If you center your focus on God through these four aspects, rather than on yourself, I believe your faith will be strengthened to receive your healing!

Xzavier was a happy baby and always had a smile on his face from the moment he entered the world. However, soon after he was given a series of vaccinations, his life took an unexpected turn. When pinpoint blood spots emerged all over his body, his parents, Isaac and Mara De Los Reyes, found themselves on a frantic trip to the emergency room. Low blood platelet levels created a critical situation, leading doctors to give Xzavier a blood transfusion. The subsequent diagnosis of sensory processing disorder marked the beginning of a challenging chapter for the De Los Reyes family.

"The day came when he blocked me from wiping his tears," Mara says. "He said, 'No, Mommy. You can't wipe my tears.' This condition was stealing my motherhood," she recalls.

Desperate for answers, Isaac stayed awake at night scouring the internet. One night, a YouTube video featuring Andrew Wommack brought a glimmer of hope regarding healing for their son. Andrew taught that it wasn't a matter of getting God to do something. God had done His part. It was up to them as believers to draw it out, because as Jesus is, so are we in this world (1 John 4:17).

Realizing that Jesus had already provided healing for Xzavier, the family focused all their attention on God's Word. They watched and rewatched *Healing Journeys* videos and diligently studied Andrew's booklet *The Truth About Healing: An Introduction to God Wants*

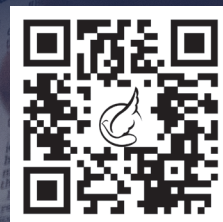

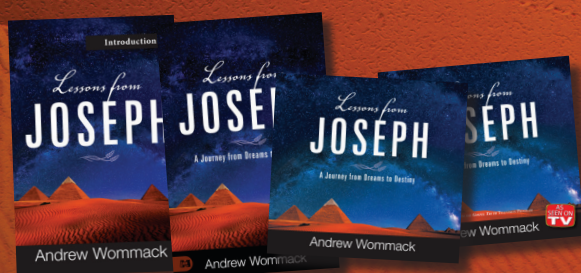
