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Few moments in history hold as much weight and significance as Jesus' final words to His disciples on the night of His arrest. As He faced the darkest hour of His earthly ministry and stood on the brink of His crucifixion, facing betrayal, agony, and death, His words to His disciples were filled with urgency and importance:

Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.

John 14:1

Jesus knew the disciples were about to face the greatest crisis of their lives, and He wanted to prepare them for it. It's evident from the scriptural account that the disciples didn't understand about the Resurrection, even though Jesus had told them fourteen different times that He would be crucified. And seven of those fourteen times, He included that He would rise again on the third day. Still, this was not in the forefront of their minds.

From their perspective, it seemed that all the hopes they had pinned on Jesus as the Messiah the one who would redeem Israel and deliver them from Roman occupation—were completely shattered. Consequently, not only were they spiritually affected, but their lives were in danger merely by association. You know, Scripture highlights that after Jesus was arrested, Peter denied Him three times. But it wasn't only Peter who fled—all of the disciples forsook Jesus.

Maybe you find yourself in a crisis as you read this. It might even be an extremely critical situation in your marriage, business, or finances. There are many different types of challenging circumstances we can all face in life, and they can really seem overwhelming. While I don't want to diminish whatever you might be going through, I truly believe it doesn't compare to the crisis these disciples were dealing with. I know that's a bold statement, but I believe it to be true.

Remember, they had pinned all of their hopes on

Jesus. They'd given up everything, and now it seemed as if everything they had believed was a lie. They had left families, homes, businesses—they forsook it all, and without a backup plan. So, when Jesus was arrested, it looked like total failure. And on top of all that, their very lives were now in jeopardy. This was a major crisis situation.

I believe Satan knows where we're vulnerable. He sometimes sees our weaknesses better than we do. Being a spiritual creature, he doesn't just perceive things in the natural realm. I believe he saw that these disciples were the ones Jesus was entrusting His entire kingdom to and that Jesus was depending on them. And because of that, I believe Satan was throwing everything he had at them—depression, discouragement, fear, anything he could use to try to snuff these guys out. After all, they were the ones who would carry on the message Jesus had left with them. So, they likely faced demonic opposition during this time that few of us have ever experienced.

I share all of that to provide some background. Imagine yourself in the shoes of Jesus' disciples, your heart heavy with apprehension as you confront all the uncertainties amidst all these events. And the very first thing Jesus says is to not let your heart be troubled. I tell you, this is just phenomenal.

You know, in many churches today, psychology has infiltrated people's thinking. Consequently, some





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believe that embracing your humanity means not suppressing any feelings or emotions but rather just letting everything out and venting. We've gotten to the point where we indulge our emotions and even criticize people if they don't fall apart like a two-dollar suitcase when something bad happens.

Psychology teaches that we're all just evolved animals rather than spiritual beings and that we can't regulate our emotions. As a result, many people feel completely out of control, thinking, I can't help how I feel. If this person does this to me, this is the reaction I'll have.

Let me just say this in love—that is bondage. If you are a person who just vents, without any control over your emotions, you are a disaster waiting to happen. I know that this might offend some people, but it is absolutely true. James 1:15 says that sin is conceived in lust, which is the emotional arena. So, you've got to stop it at the conception stage.

Jesus, knowing that the disciples were going to see Him arrested that very night and then beaten and crucified, wanted to comfort His disciples by telling them to not let their hearts be troubled. There are so many things we can learn from this, and one of them is that when you're in a crisis, you need to take it to the Lord. You can choose to give Him your emotions and let His love, joy, and peace come and fill that place where your negative emotions are brewing.

I am not teaching denial. I am teaching that you can deny those emotions permission to control you. You can acknowledge that something somebody did or said bothered or hurt you, but you don't have to let it dominate, control, or influence your emotions.

I guarantee you that Jesus, as He hung on the cross, wasn't feeling goosebumps of love going up and down His spine for people. Yet He said, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). It was a choice. He went against what He was feeling, and He operated by choice. Love is not emotionless, but it is a choice and a commitment that you make. So, the answer isn't suppressing or venting your emotions. What you need to do is cast your cares over on the Lord and let God come in and heal your heart.

Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.

1 Peter 5:7

There is an anointing on Jesus to heal broken hearts. We need to get to the place where even if we're faced with death, we can't help but praise God, knowing that heaven awaits. If we truly grasp this, then any earthly trouble we encounter would just pale in comparison to the glory ahead. Praise God.

So, when you're tempted to let fear or anxiety dominate your emotions, take Jesus' words to heart. If they could sustain His disciples on the eve of His crucifixion, they can sustain us today.

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Don't Despise His Victory 🌽

But Jesus said to them, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." And they said to Him, "**We have here only** five loaves and two fish."

> Matthew 14:16–17, New King James Version, emphasis added

When confronted with a challenge, a lack-minded Christian will often respond, "I only have." *I only have* a fourth-grade education. *I only have* ten dollars in the bank. *I only have* a broken family. Or they'll say, "If you only knew." *If you only knew* what's gone on in my life. This attitude of limitation is something we've all dealt with.

In my own life, I've faced self-imposed limitations. It's as if I were saying to Jesus, "Thanks for the confidence about feeding thousands, but *I only have*..." This implies that He needs to find some other way to accomplish His purposes.

In Psalm 106, David recounted the trials and tribulations of Israel during their journey through the wilderness—an ongoing cycle of momentary rejoicing and then returning to sin and rebellion.

They forgot God their Savior, Who had done great things in Egypt. . . . Then they despised the pleasant land; They did not believe His word.

Psalm 106:21 and 24, *NKJV*, emphasis added

When you doubt the goodness of God, the finished work of Christ, His presence in you, and the authority and faith that reside in you, you're effectively despising the "pleasant land." By focusing on your problems, you're forgetting all the good things God has done and failing to grasp the fullness of His grace.




Here's a simple analogy. Imagine the Old Covenant as an American football game. In this game, you're playing on a team of six-year-olds against the Law of Moses essentially facing off against the Kansas City Chiefs (the 2023 and 2024 Super Bowl champions). In that matchup, you can't win.

However, you're not playing in that Old Covenant American football game anymore. Now you're in a New Covenant baseball game with completely different rules. Some say, "Okay, I understand I'm in the New Covenant baseball game, but I keep striking out."

Listen, we all strike out. No one has gotten a hit, except for one person on the team: Jesus Christ, who's both a pitcher and a batter. He pitched a perfect game and then hit four home runs! Through Jesus, you win, enter into the New Covenant, and get the ring, the check, and the parade.

Praise God! The faith of God is in you, the blessings of God are for you, and the grace of God is upon you. Don't despise the pleasant land of Christ in you as a born-again believer.

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Book Excerpt from Proverbs: Timeless Wisdom for a Life of Blessing 🦉

As we anticipate a week of summer fun at our July Summer Family Bible Conference, this excerpt from Andrew Wommack's book *Proverbs: Timeless Wisdom for a Life of Blessing* serves as a timely reminder of the profound importance of the fear of the Lord and the value of honoring parents. These principles are foundational in shaping not only our own lives but also those of our children and future generations.

My son, hear the instruction of thy father, and forsake not the law of thy mother.

Proverbs 1:8

Proverbs 1:7 says that the beginning of knowledge is the fear of the Lord, and here, in verse 8, Solomon begins to give some of this knowledge. He starts by talking about honoring your father and mother. I think it's significant that the very first thing he does is lay a foundation that goes back to childhood. We need to honor our parents.

In Ephesians 6:2, Paul said this same thing. One of the Ten Commandments is to honor your father and mother so your days would be long upon the land (Ex. 20:12 and Deut. 5:16). There are many of you who have rejected your parents' authority. From childhood, there's been rebellion in you, and you don't respect your parents. You may not have connected the dots, but the problems that you have today—not being able to keep relationships going, not being able to keep a job, or always being in crisis—could be traced all the way back to your childhood when you were in rebellion and didn't submit to your parents' authority.

We have a major lack of respect for authority today. Certainly, there are people in authority who do things wrong; there always have been. But we have some people today who have zero respect for authority. I could apply this in a million different ways, but we have entire cultures today that hate police officers and disrespect them. Are there bad police officers? Yes. And if they are bad, they ought to be prosecuted. There are also bad preachers today, but that doesn't mean that all preachers are bad. There are bad lawyers. That doesn't mean all lawyers are bad.

Every profession, every group, has bad people in it. There will always be evil people who misrepresent, but to reject authority is a major problem. One of the very first things that this wise man Solomon started saying by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit is that you need to listen to your parents. This doesn't mean that you should never disobey ungodly commands. There are bad parents, but you can respect their authority while not obeying anything that is contrary to God's Word. But honoring your parents is a beginning place for wisdom.

Nurse Fights Colorado to Continue Providing Abortion Reversal Treatment

Colorado's law prohibiting medical professionals from administering abortion pill reversal (APR) forces women to undergo abortions they no longer want.

Chelsea Mynyk, of Castle Rock Women's Health, is fighting the investigation into her use of APR, a safe, effective treatment designed for women who change their minds about abortion. APR is used to reverse the effects of chemical abortion drugs, ultimately saving the life of the unborn child. Alliance Defending Freedom is supporting her in defending her right to offer this life-saving protocol.

According to Kevin Theriot, senior counsel with ADF and a member of ADF's Center for Life Team, the investigation is unlawful because it "is chilling Chelsea's rights and her free exercise right to offer something to help save lives and also her free speech rights, which she uses to communicate to women that she offers these services."



Chelsea is currently assisting two clients with APR. She says, "They immediately regretted their decision after taking that first chemical abortion drug, mifepristone. They were in tears of desperation, wanting to know if there was something they could take to save their babies and to help them. Their babies are [now] doing well [and] they continue to grow." In discussing her experience in serving patients who've had a change of heart regarding abortion, Chelsea says that it's "amazing to see the moms go from fear and overwhelming pressures" to "falling in love with their babies when they see them on ultrasound."

Dropping the Hot Potato of Unforgiveness

Have you ever felt the weight of a strained relationship? Whether it's a rift with a friend, a spat with a sibling, or a falling-out with a colleague, we've all grappled with this. But in the midst of these challenges, there's a way forward to peace and healing, and it all starts with forgiveness.

In our relationship with God through Christ, our vertical walk with God is constant because of His faithfulness to us. However, our horizontal walk with people is different. It takes two individuals for there to be restoration and reconciliation when conflict arises. It isn't completely up to us.

If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men.

Romans 12:18, New King James Version

Throughout the Scriptures we see many examples of relational challenges, such as Adam and Eve rejecting fellowship with the Lord, Joseph's brothers selling him into slavery, the falling-out of Paul and Barnabas, and Judas' betrayal of Jesus. Yet even while enduring rejection and pain, Jesus modeled radical forgiveness, even to those who crucified Him, praying, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).

John 13:35 reminds us that our love for one another is a defining characteristic of our faith and discipleship. If Jesus, in His boundless mercy, can forgive us and those who wronged Him, who are we to withhold forgiveness from others? It's not about forgetting or condoning hurtful actions it's simply a choice we make.

I've personally wrestled with forgiveness, even after extending it to others. The process wasn't easy, and lingering feelings of bitterness sometimes persisted. But as I continually affirmed



my choice to forgive, those emotions gradually faded away until they were completely gone.

The story of Job serves as a powerful illustration of the transformative power of forgiveness. Despite facing unimaginable suffering, Job's willingness to pray for his friends ultimately led to his own restoration and abundance. It's a vivid reminder that forgiveness is not just for the benefit of others but for our own well-being too.

And the LORD restored Job's losses when he prayed for his friends. Indeed the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before.

Job 42:10, NKJV

Imagine forgiveness as dropping a hot potato. When you choose to hold onto the potato (or the unforgiveness), it only prolongs the pain. But when you make a conscious decision to forgive and let go of anger or bitterness, you "drop the potato." Through prayer and a deep understanding of Jesus' love, you and I can embrace forgiveness and experience the liberating power it brings.


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Goal of the Cross 🖉



I love the beautiful redemptive story that you and I have been invited into through the finished work of the cross. No matter how you feel about yourself, no matter what somebody tells you—look to the cross and see God's love for you.

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive by the Spirit.

1 Peter 3:18, New King James Version

People will often come up to me and ask me to pray with them to receive a revelation of God's love for them. That's a great desire, but if you don't first look at the cross and the power that was demonstrated there, you're always going to wonder if you've done enough to earn His love. Jesus died *for* you and *as* you before you even realized you needed a Savior. Now, that's the love of God.

Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Hebrews 12:2, NKJV, emphasis added

Jesus knew the redemptive story. He knew that He was purchasing you and me, setting us free so that we could have relationship with Him. Hebrews 12:2 says that He *despised* the shame, basically meaning that He looked down on the shame as if to say, *I'm not* going to let the voice of shame stop me. I have joy. I have vision set before Me of what this cross is going to accomplish.

Don't let the world tell you that you've disqualified yourself. I'm telling you, the cross brings a whole other level of freedom from the guilt, condemnation, and shame of the past. And the thing is, we've all done some dumb things. You can keep looking back with regret, or you can say, "Thank You, Jesus. I despise that shame. I despise that guilt and condemnation. I do not let it have a voice in my life. I have a joy set before me, the same joy that You had—the joy of relationship. And now I can have as much of God as I want [Jer. 29:13]."

As they passed by the fig tree he had cursed, the disciples noticed it had withered from the roots up.

> Mark 11:20, New Living Translation

When the doctors found a massive, four-inch growth on her colon, Cheri Blair had a choice: prepare for the worst, or stand on the revelation that by the stripes of Jesus, she was already healed.

One morning, as Cheri and a friend discussed scriptural truths regarding healing, Cheri experienced an unexpected sharp pain in her side. She couldn't help but note the irony, saying to her friend, "This is quite ironic that we're sitting here discussing healing, and now I'm having this unusual problem coming up."

Instead of dismissing the pain, Cheri decided to lean into her faith. But as the hours passed, the pain only intensified, prompting her mother and her husband, Tim, to rush her to the emergency room. The diagnosis? A menacing four-inch tumor in her colon. Tim recalls, **"Everything just started**

moving quickly." Fear threatened to overwhelm them, but Cheri remained steadfast in her trust in God's healing power.

While awaiting surgery scheduled for a few days later, Cheri experienced another surge of pain, this time on the opposite side of the mass. In that moment, she and Tim joined hands and came into agreement, rejecting fear and standing firm in their Godgiven authority.

Rather than giving way to despair, Cheri took a bold step of faith. She gathered a group of strong believers at a rented coffee shop and united in prayer and gratitude for the healing already provided. "I was already believing it was already done, so there was no need to ask, beg, or plead," Cheri explains.

Among those standing in faith with her were Richard and Donna Harris, a couple who had also studied Andrew's teachings and firmly believed that by the stripes of Jesus, Cheri was already healed. Together, the couple experienced a powerful vision of a peach shriveled up to nothing but a pit—a symbol of the miraculous healing taking place within Cheri's body. When the day of surgery arrived, the doctor emerged from the procedure with an unusual report. Despite a thorough examination, they were able to find only one thing: a small mass of tissue the size of a peach pit.



Today, Cheri lives cancer-free, a living testimony to God's faithfulness and healing touch. She continues to renew her mind daily, immersing herself in the revelations that changed her life forever.
