LESSONS FROM DAVID

You Don't Have to Live It to Learn It

Did you know some of the most important lessons you will ever learn already happened to somebody else? God didn't give us the Bible just to inform us—He gave it to transform us. One of the things I love about the Word of God is that it just tells you like it is. It gives you the good, the bad, and the ugly so you can learn from it.

*Now these things were our examples, to the intent we should not lust after evil things, as they also lusted. Neither be ye idolaters, as were some of them; . . . Now all **these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come.***

1 Corinthians 10:6–7 and 11,
emphasis added

These things were written for our learning. They are examples. I can't overstate how important it is for you to learn from other people's lives at their expense, not yours.

I got born again when I was eight years old, and I didn't go through a period of rebellion or spend years running from God. Because of that, some people assume I didn't really learn much. But you don't have to destroy your life to understand destruction. You can look at David's life and learn what sin does without ever committing it yourself. You can see the pain of failure without walking through it personally. That is wisdom—learning through Scripture instead of experience.

Most people think of David as the man after God's own heart—and he was (Acts 13:22). But the Bible never just shows you the highlight reel. It shows everything—his worship *and* his weakness, his courage *and* his compromise, his victories *and* his failures. The Bible doesn't sugarcoat it. It records every rotten detail so we can learn from it.

I've learned some lessons from David that have literally transformed my life. I didn't need to commit adultery to understand the damage it does. I didn't need to cover up sin to learn the heavy consequences it brings. I learned it from David. And I also learned from his victories—his courage against

Goliath, his heart for worship, and his dependence on God when everything else was shaking.

The Trap of People-Pleasing

Before you can really understand David, you have to understand Saul. Saul was Israel's first king, handpicked by God. On the outside, he had everything going for him—tall, impressive, exactly what people expected a king to look like. **But on the inside, he was controlled by something very dangerous: the opinions of people.**

When he was chosen, he hid because he was overwhelmed by what everyone might think about him—and that was the root of his problem. Because when you live for approval, you will eventually stop obeying God in order to protect your image.

Proverbs 29:25 says, "*The fear of man bringeth a snare.*" It doesn't just influence you—it traps you.

Even when Saul was anointed, that insecurity didn't disappear. It just waited for pressure. And that pressure came at Gilgal (1 Samuel 13). The Philistines outnumbered Saul's army big-time. The men were scattering, fear was rising, and Samuel didn't arrive when Saul expected him. So Saul was faced with a decision: wait on God or take control himself. He chose to act.

He offered the sacrifice himself, something he was never supposed to do, and he knew it. He forced it. When Samuel showed up, Saul tried to blame the circumstances and the pressure, but there's never a good excuse for disobeying God. Samuel said to him, "*Thou hast done foolishly: . . . The LORD hath sought him a man after his own heart*" (1 Sam. 13:13–14). That moment didn't just expose Saul's mistake—it redirected the future of Israel. That is huge.

Saul's life also shows something important about the anointing of God. When the Spirit of the Lord came upon him in 1 Samuel 11:6–7, he became bold and acted differently than his natural personality. That is what the anointing does—it empowers you beyond your ability. I've seen that in my own life, moments where God spoke and suddenly there was a boldness I didn't have before. But here is the key: the anointing is never a

substitute for obedience. You can be empowered and still miss God if you choose fear over faith.

And this is where it gets very practical. Life will pressure you. Circumstances will argue with you. Fear will try to talk you out of obedience. But obedience to God is not based on convenience, outcome, or risk. It is based on trust. Most people decide obedience based on consequences, but real obedience is settled before the pressure comes.

You need to ask yourself if you're going to learn from David or repeat Saul. The fear of man will trap you, and pressure will expose you. So you just need to obey God and leave the results up to Him. That alone will save you years of frustration if you learn it.

The truth is, if you don't learn these things at David's expense, you're going to learn them at your own. But even if you've already messed up, you can take encouragement from David. He was a man who

messed up just about as much as anybody possibly could, and yet God did not forsake him. God hasn't forsaken you either (Heb. 13:5).

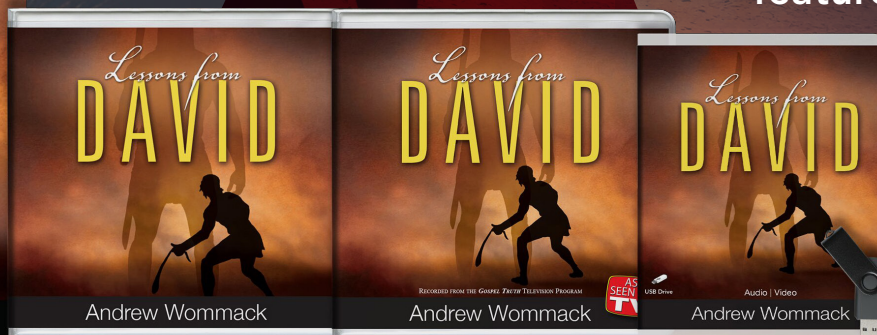
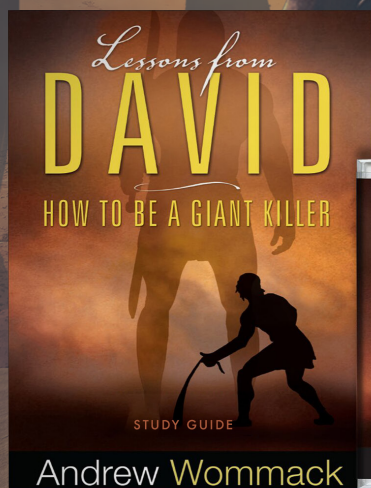

CELEBRATING THE CLASS OF 2026

This spring, Charis Bible College celebrated the graduation of **51 students** whose lives have been transformed by the Word of God. More than a graduation ceremony, it was a celebration of God's faithfulness as students completed 2 or 3 years of biblical training and stepped into the next season equipped to carry the Gospel deeper into their communities, all empowered by grace and rooted in truth.

One of the greatest blessings at Charis is watching the change that takes place throughout the school year. Students arrive from all walks of life, each with a desire to know God more deeply. As they immerse themselves in His Word, we see lasting change take place. They grow in their understanding of Scripture, learn to recognize and follow the leading of the Holy Spirit, and develop the confidence to minister to others in their everyday lives.

This year, students had the opportunity to put everything they had learned into practice during their missions trip to **Belize**. As they ministered alongside local churches and communities, they witnessed **175 salvations, 234 confirmed healings, and 84 baptisms in the Holy Spirit**. These incredible testimonies are a reminder that God's Word is alive, and His power is still transforming lives today.

The impact didn't end when the team returned home. Our students have continued to step out in faith across Canada, ministering to friends, coworkers, neighbors, and strangers with the same confidence they gained throughout the year. Whether praying for the sick, sharing the Gospel, or encouraging someone with God's love, they are continuing to live out what they learned at Charis. These moments are just a glimpse of the fruit that comes through dedicated discipleship and partnership. Every graduate represents a seed sown and a harvest that is only just beginning. Peter, one of this year's graduates, shared:

"Charis has been absolutely life-transforming for me in every way I could imagine. From the day I arrived, I felt like I had found a family. I've grown spiritually, built lifelong friendships, and been challenged to step out in ways I never expected. During our mission trip to Belize, God even used me to minister prophetically, something I never thought I would do, and we had the opportunity to preach in a maximum-security prison. I'll never forget what God did during this year."

Reshma also reflected on her experience:

"I came to Charis as a new believer, hungry for Jesus, and that hunger was met here. God used this year to shape and refine me, giving me a strong biblical foundation and the confidence to share His love with others. Today, I'm able to minister at my workplace, bringing hope to people who desperately need it. I'm so thankful God brought me to Charis and prepared me for what He's called me to do."
